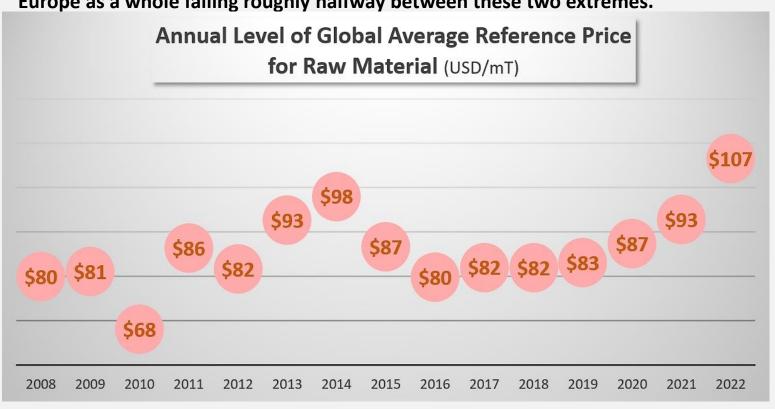
A QUICK LOOK ON THE PERFORMANCE OF THE TOMATO MARKET AS A TOOL TO HELP US IDENTIFY OUR PURCHASING STRATEGIES

## PRICES OF RAW MATERIAL FOR 2022 CROP VS 2021

At nearly USD 107 /mT, the overall average value of tomatoes as raw materials for processing has jumped by +21% compared to the average of the three previous seasons.

- Reasons for the unprecedented rise in the prices of tomato as a "raw material":
  - ✓ Increasing industrial demand mirrored by decreasing agricultural supply
  - ✓ Uncertain weather conditions
  - ✓ Difficult water supply
  - ✓ Covid related supply chain issues and lack of seasonal workers
  - ✓ Tensions due to the war in Ukraine
  - Extraordinary increases in the costs of all inputs
  - ✓ Competition with less risky or more profitable alternative crops
  - ✓ For Italy, government contributions for tomato crops will decrease by 60% in the next three years making this area less interesting for farmers
- The value of US tomatoes has jumped by +24% compared to the price agreed in 2021, followed by European tomatoes (+23% in Spain, +16% in Greece, +14% in Portugal, +9% in France) and other leading countries of the sector (+21% in Turkey, +9% in China).
- The largest increase of the year was recorded in California, the smallest in China, with Europe as a whole falling roughly halfway between these two extremes.









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## **ITALY**

• As far as Italy is concerned, prices in 2021 were as follows:

North – 92€/mt

South – 105€/mt for round tomato and 115€/mt for long tomato

- > 2020 prices for the North were **fixed in April** at 108.5€/mt up +18% against previous year. For the South, an agreement has yet to be reached.
- ➤ The demand from farmers in the south is massive and despite the industry's willingness to grant a higher price increase in comparison to what was granted in the North, farmers have arbitrarily put forward a request for an increase that is considered unjustified by processors, who acknowledge the increases in production costs but claim these impact the South in the same way as the North. Processors have offered 120€/mt for round variety and 130€/mt for the long variety but the request is 140€/mt and 150€/mt respectively.
- Farmers are worried about the cost of diesel used in agriculture (from 0.75€/litre to 1.40€/litre) as well as the cost of fertilizers and plastics. Farmers say that costs have increased by 35% so the price they are demanding is not negotiable.
- ➤ The price agreed with farmers for the raw material has never been so unimportant in defining the cost of finished products as this year. Supply and demand, energy costs, and opportunities are the defining factors. Retailers are diversifying their supply base in order to guarantee volumes.

## VOLUMES EXPECTED 2022 VS 2021

 According to Amitom, the association of tomato processors of the Mediterranean region, the Italian 2022 crop will be 10% lower than last year. In the North the estimates are to collect 2.75 million tons, down 10,2% and in the South the estimates are for 2,65 million tons, namely 10% down from last year.

## **WEATHER**

• High temperatures are going to affect this year's crop. Above average 1°C will reduce yields by 0,4 ton/ha. Farmers are particularly worried about lack of rain.
